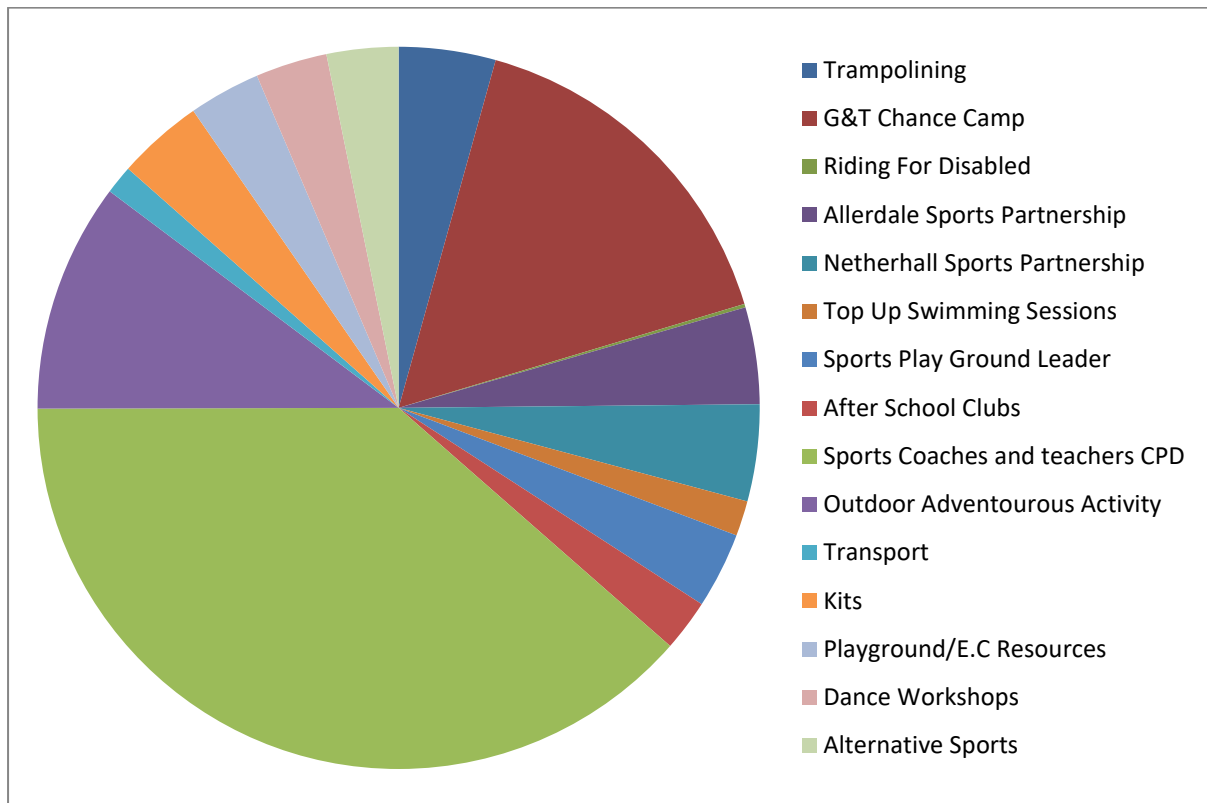


Allocation of the Sports Premium funding for the financial year 2017 to 2018 is calculated in the following way:

Schools with 17 or more pupils receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil.

Maryport CE Junior School will receive a total of £17,330 over the course of the financial year.



Impact of funding so far:

- MJS has maintained a high level of involvement in intra and inter school competitions. This often involves 3 teams per sport.
- Some teams have achieved Regional and county finals.
- Development of 'Sports leaders' in year 4 and 5.
- More children attending after school clubs due to the wide variety of sports offered.

- Wide variety of alternative sporting opportunities in the school. E.g. trampolining and archery.
- 'Top up' swimming sessions.
- Extra Cycle Wise provision for children who do not meet the standard in Y5.
- Continued success in the Sainsbury's School Games Sports Mark. We have achieved Gold in 2014/15 and 2016/17.

We propose to continue to develop the impact of sports by:

- Continue sports competitions participation.
- Continue to increase girl's engagement in PE and after school clubs.
- Provide intervention for children who require additional support .
- Invest in dance teaching resources, to enhance teaching of dance in the curriculum.
- Further alternative sporting opportunities for children.

Sustainability

We propose to sustain the improvements through continued professional development of all staff. Sports Coaches are training teachers to develop the key skills. Our playground leader is working closely with the mid day supervisors so that they can maintain active lunch time games and clubs. Young leaders within the school are passing on their expertise to younger children in the school.
